Dear Students,

We are really looking forward to you coming to our new show, “London Calling.” This preparation material will help you understand what is going on in the show and who everyone in the play is. Then you can just sit back, relax, and enjoy the performance.



Hi, I'm Oliver. There are two words you will hear a lot in our play. Hamlet and Shakespeare. Hamlet is a character from a famous play; it is also the name of the play.

A guy called Shakespeare wrote the play. You might have heard of him. The play is very long, and there are lots of words in it, but it is a great story.

But don't worry, our play is not so long and not so wordy, but it is definitely a great story.

STORY

Class 8F from Rathsrotten High-school are going to London. They want to perform Hamlet in the ***National Shakespeare Competition***. They travel to the Globe Theatre with their teacher, Mr. Keen. He is nice, but not very well-organised.

At the same time, four criminals break into the ***Royal Artefacts Museum in London***. They steal a sword, a tiara and a goblet, worth 10 million pounds. In the chaos at ***Trafalgar Square***, the bags of the criminals get mixed up with the bags of the school kids. But the real problem is much worse. The young actors have not just lost their bags but also their Hamlet and need to find a new one before they can go on stage.

CHARACTERS

There are many characters in this show. It might be a bit confusing at first, but that's OK. There are 11 main characters (Hauptrollen) and a few minor roles (Nebenrollen)

The SCHOOL KIDS and their TEACHER

Mr. Keen: Mr. Keen is a young teacher who likes Shakespeare. It is his idea to enter into the Shakespeare Competition. His class likes him. The school principal does not. He is usually running late or has forgotten something.



Sam: Sam's hobbies are annoying people and taking things from them. Sometimes he gives them back. Sometimes he doesn't. Some people call that stealing. He knows everyone in his class is better than him. Even his best friend, Oliver. Sam has not found what he is good at yet. Except stealing.



Svetlana: Svetlana and Sam do not like each other. He calls her "sweaty llama," and she calls him "baby thief." Actually, Svetlana does not really like anyone. She thinks Oliver is weird but interesting. She could be good at school, but she doesn't want to be...yet.



Belle: Belle is good at everything except being patient (geduldig sein). She is good at school, good at sports; she is organised and on time. She is also good at acting and plays two roles (Rollen oder Figuren) in the school theatre show. She is bad at being nice to people who are not as good as her. She thinks her brother Oliver is weird.

Oliver: Oliver is Belle's twin brother. He and Belle are very different. Oliver likes to say strange things. He finds his sister confusing. He and Sam have been friends since kindergarten. But Oliver is not sure that he likes Sam any more.

Daphne: Daphne tries to be good at everything. She is the stage manager and organiser of the school theatre show. She doesn't really have any friends. Everyone finds her annoying, except Cam. She would like to play a role in Hamlet, but no one else wants her to. Including Mr. Keen.



Cam: Cam is short for Cameron. Cam's job is doing the costumes and props (Requisiten). Which is difficult because he often forgets things. Cam does not want to be in the play. He gets stage fright (Lampenfieber). He is a nice guy and thinks he is friends with everyone.

There are also four criminals – **The London Four** - who break into the Royal Artefacts Museum. "John-O", "Stella-V", "Darling" and "N". Darling's real name is Alfred Fitzsimmons. Nobody knows what "N's" real name is. Is it Nina, Natasha, Natalie? Some say that the "N" stands for "Nobody". You will learn more about them in the show.

Minor roles: A few police officers and Tomithy – a well-dressed street scam-artist.



Oliver says:

Hamlet also means small town or village in English. But you don't really need to know this. A lot of English speaking people don't know this either.

SCENE TWO – THE BUS ROLL CALL

Enter Mr.Keen. Stage Right with clip board.

A few moments later, enter Svetlana. Stage Right.

Mr Keen: Good Morning Svetlana, early bird gets the worm...

Svetlana: Good Morning, Mr Keen

Mr Keen: ready to go then?!

Svetlana: Yes, Mr Keen.

Mr Keen: Could I have your... umm.... Do you have your, um form? Enter Belle.

Svetlana: No, Mr Keen. She enters the bus.

Mr Keen: Well that's umm... that's umm... just fine then....

Belle: Hello Mr. Keen, here is a map of London, here is my bag and here is my form. Oh, and here is Oliver's form, he left it on the kitchen table, of course. My brother is so stupid.

Mr. Keen: Thank-you Isabelle... I think Enter Daphne Stage Right

Daphne: Hi, Mr. Keen.

Keen: Ah hellooo Daphne...

Daphne: Can I sit next to you?

Mr. Keen: No.

Daphne: Good to know. Exit stage left.

Cam: enter Cam. Hey Mr Keen, sorry I, um my little brother... and then we... and the car... and I thought...

Keen: OK, Cam, just get on the bus.

Cam: Here's my form. Cam sneezes and gets onto the bus.

Keen: Thanks... erghhgggh

Cam: Oh no, Mr Keen, I forgot the bag with the props!

Keen: Well, run Cam, run! Cam exit stage right

Enter Oliver and Sam stage left.

Oliver: Hi, Mr Keen, have you ever seen an alien?

Sam: Hey Mr Keen!

Mr Keen: Ah, Samuel. Got your form? No, I don't think I have Oliver...

Sam: Right here Mr. Keen

Mr. Keen: It's not signed, Samuel.

Sam: Well, my mum was going to sign it, but then she didn't.

Keen: Right, get on the bus, you two. Listen, will be in London in about six hours. Amanda is not here but...

Sam: Is Amanda dead, sir?

Oliver: Woah, what happened?

Mr. Keen: Amanda is not dead, Sam. Her grandma however is. She will join us in London at the theatre.

Oliver: The grandma?

Keen: No Oliver, Amanda. So, kids, the rules of our trip:

Rule Number One: Do what Mr. Keen says, Rule Number two: Still do what Mr. Keen says and Sam, rule number three?

Sam: Ahh, take a chill pill Mr Keen.

Mr Keen: Important! Watch out for your bags. Money was stolen from my wallet yesterday during a sports lesson. And there are lots of pickpockets and other thieves in London, Samuel, are you listening? Closes the bus door.

Sam: Hey, What did I do?

Oliver: Mr. Keen, can we listen to music?

Mr. Keen: Yes please! Turns on radio London here we come!
